



Thank you for visiting Guntersville and Guntersville Lake. The shaded area on this map indicates the area of Lake Guntersville that is designated “RESTRICTED AREA – NO HUNTING”.

This area was identified and agreed upon by a committee composed of members of the Alabama Waterfowl Association, Alabama Department of Conservation, Alabama Marine Police, Tennessee Valley Authority, City of Guntersville and Guntersville Police Department. As stated by the “restricted” designation, no hunting will be allowed in this particular section of the lake, which is proposed for development into a wildlife management area. Hunting will be allowed in all other areas of the shoreline around Lake Guntersville. Hunting regulations will be enforced by Alabama Game & Fish, whose handbook entitled “Alabama Department of Conservation and Natural Resources 2006-2007 Hunting and Fishing Digest” states that “It is illegal to hunt within 100 yards of any dwelling without the permission of the owner or lessee, or discharge a firearm while hunting so that any projectile strikes any dwelling or building used for human occupation, or any commercial vessel, without the permission of the owner or lessee. This does not apply to a landowner or member of his/her immediate family hunting on his/her own property, provided that no projectile strikes the above property of another without the permission of the owner or lessee.”

The long-range goal of the above committee is to increase the wildlife and waterfowl population in and around Lake Guntersville, through a cooperative effort between local and state law enforcement agencies and hunters who frequent the area.
