Ground-Fault Circuit-Interrupters

To protect against electric shocks, Article 210.8 of NEC requires that personnel ground-fault protection be provided for all 125-volt, 15 and 20-ampere receptacle outlets in dwellings as follows:

- 1. Bathrooms (An area including a basin with one or more of the following: A toilet, a tub or a shower.
- 2. Outdoors
- 3. In kitchen, for all receptacles that serve the countertop surfaces. This includes receptacles installed on islands and peninsulas.
- 4. Any receptacle within 6 feet of a laundry, utility, or wet bar sink.
- 5. In attached or detached garages
- 6. In other buildings (sheds, workshops, or storage)
- 7. In crawl spaces that are at or below grade.
- 8. In unfinished basements.
- 9. For swimming pools
- 10. For the branch-circuit supplying heated floors in bathrooms and hydromassage bathtub, spa and hot tub locations.
